CDBG Overview

Meridian's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program receives funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to promote decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities principally for persons with low to moderate incomes.



Housing Stability

All projects should lead back to creating housing stability.



Low-Mod Income

Projects must benefit those with a low to moderate income.



Meridian Resident

All projects must benefit those within the Meridian City limits.

Income Eligibility

HUD defines low to moderate income as being at or below 80% of the area median income (AMI). This chart shows the maximum income per household size as of June 2023.

Household Size	80% AMI
1 Person	\$49,950
2 Person	\$57,050
3 Person	\$64,200
4 Person	\$71,300



Requesting Public Input

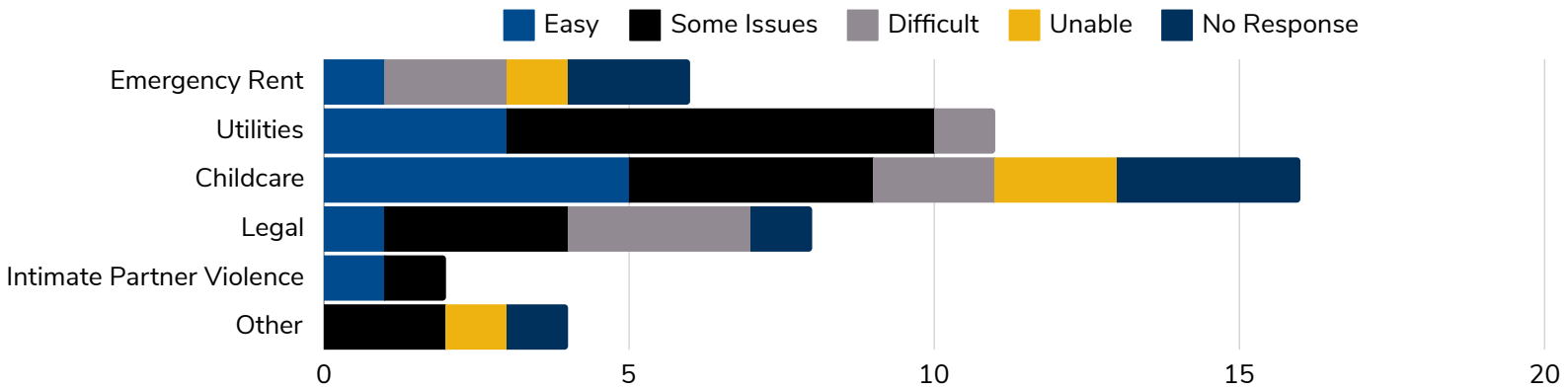
The City requested public input on the services needed in Meridian in the upcoming funding year. There was a public comment period from March 15, 2024 to April 7, 2024 with two public hearings and two in-person events during that time. **50 residents** responded to an online survey and **83 people** voted at the in-person events.

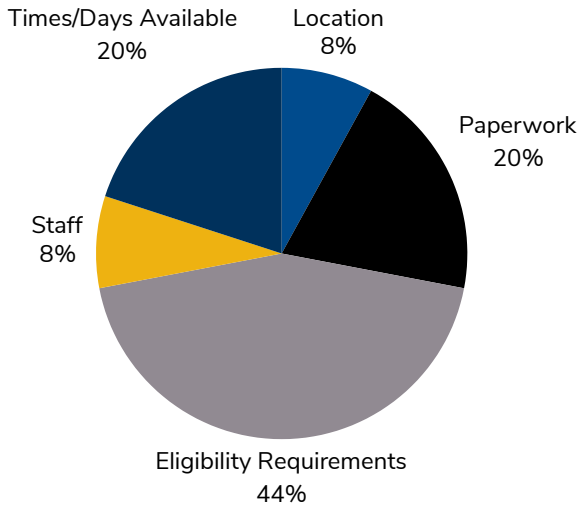
Survey Results

The online survey requested input from residents regarding the necessary services in the community over the previous year, the ease of accessing these services, and any additional services they wish to have. Out of the 50 respondents, 50% mentioned they or someone they knew required access to services in the past year.
